1. Carol Gaff - librarian, who is making 1.26 an hour should be put on a monthly salary basis of \$190 per month. 10 days sick leave not accumulative and 2 weeks vacation with pay.

We feel Mrs Gaff - due to her long tenure of service - her loyalty and Cooperation and the fact that she is an experienced employee working at a rate less than the starting rate of the newest street worker - She is a valued employee.

2. Addie Diedrich - making 1.10 an hour should have 1.15 an hr.

~~As with~~ She is an experienced, loyal + cooperative worker.

3. For the two part time workers Joyce Schwalb and Brenda Palmer, who have been receiving 55¢ an hr., we feel 60¢ could be given them as

Their work and responsibility has increased and they have been with us for several years. We consider that 60¢, however, will be the maximum wage for part time library help. County Librarians maximum is 60¢ and they are a lot larger than we are. We feel that the experience of working in a library and the amount of knowledge gained should be invaluable for College Students.

Any new part time help in the future would start at 50¢ an hour -
