

"Small, but mighty" aptly describes team size in '78. The team showed who was number one by winning Grass Lake Invitational, Class AA Blade Relays where B. Veldhoff was named most valuable player, LCAA League meet and Regionals. They also placed second at Bath Invitational. Despite 4 meets being run in the rain, 9 new records were set. In the Long Jump B. Veldhoff jumped 18'1 $\frac{1}{4}$ ". In High Jump B. Bilby leaped to 5'4". Rose Hejl set records in the 110 yd. dash :11.4; the 440 dash :59.1 and the shot put 34'4 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". In the mile Mary Lou Hoag ran a 5:51.7. M. 

The Royals will be proud to have nine returning letter winners next season.


Junior Varsity Softball


