

January 8, 1968

The regular meeting of the Library Board was called to order by president, Helen Goble. All ~~Members~~ were present. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. No treasurer's report was available.

It was reported that the broken front window had finally been replaced by Ohio Plate Glass.

The annual library report recorded a total of 12,067 books now on the shelves and 4,911 readers.

The Past Presidents Club of the Blissfield Service Club presented the library with prints of the History of Michigan in Paintings series by artist Robert Thom.

Miss Goff reported the need for a new trainee to work in the library during the summer months when only one school girl is working.

Review of the library's insurance coverage indicated an increase in evaluation of contents of \$3000.00 from \$12,000 to a present value of \$15,000. Evaluation of the building was increased 10%.

\$509.00 for the Retirement Fund was ^{charged} ~~credited~~ to the library's account.

Investigation revealed that federal minimum wage did not apply to the library, only the Michigan Minimum Wage Law at \$1.25/hr.
