The lower 12 inches are pulled up and wrinkled and the hem in uneven. Certainly after a drape is pressed it should hold that press.

The auditorium is used weekly by the Kiwanis Club and Rotary Club. The men have commented on how disheveled the drapes appear. Perhaps we should post a sign on them, "These drapes by Elden Brothers." This certainly will not afford good advertisement for your business.
